- Copy the quotation or passage on the chart exactly as it appears in your book- don't forget to use quotation marks!
- Write down the page numbers on which this passage appears.
- Explain why you chose this quotation. What does it mean? **Why do you think it is important?**

You will share your work with your classmates and take your first AR of the year!




